1. OBJECTIVES:

The major objectives of the extension are as follows:

- To stop the perpetuation of gender inequality through schools as well as to address its existence in the society at large.
- To encourage the schools to take initiatives to promote gender equality in schools to create a gender sensitive and gender equal generation of men and women.
- The extension activity also focused on developing tools to make the educational system to sensitive to gender equality, conducting sessions on gender equality to bring awareness in the society.

2. Target Group: Students, guardians and Faculty members.

3. Significance of the Event: While access to education for girls has steadily increased in Assam over the decades, we are far from achieving gender equality. Through this event we focused on how to break gender stereotypes encouraging girl students to complete and pursue higher education. There is lot in common between education and gender equality; both are instrumental to the development of a society. To stop the perpetuation of gender inequality, through schools, the event focused on concepts like gender sensitive pedagogies, making schools gender neutrals and teachers as change makers.

4. Description of the Programme: The programme began sharply at 11.00 AM with the Head master Mr Utpal Boro introducing and welcoming the faculties of English Department, Rangapara College, guardians, staffs and students of Chengelimara High School. Dr. Ranendra Mohan Deka (Vice Principal, Rangapara College) gave his speech on how to talk to women and girls, making education gender sensitive, empowerment of mothers, giving proper value to women's work, making school gender-friendly etc. Mr Deependra Sarma (HOD, Department of English) expressed his views on the importance of gender awareness and education of girl child. Dr. Pamela Sarmah (Assistant Professor, Department of English, Rangapara College) spoke on the ways to promote gender equality in schools and classroom. She encouraged students to participate in group activities which would help to develop team spirit as well as gender equality. Teachers can create more gender-inclusive learning environments in some of the most gender- exclusive contexts. Mr. Niku Chetia, (Assistant Professor, Department of English) expressed that a nation needs to value every gender equally to progress at the right place. The government of India has also started taking steps to ensure gender equality. Miss Meghali Saikia (Assistant Professor, Department of English, Rangapara College) expressed her views on gender equality by providing suitable examples from social media and real life situations. Miss Bhanita Das (Assistant Professor, Department of English, Rangapara College) spoke on how to promote gender awareness in our society including child marriage, sexual harassment etc. Mr. Binod Basumatary (Assistant Teacher, Bodo medium) thanked and showed gratitude towards all present in the programme.

The deliberation was followed by a vibrant interactive session which was participated by faculty members, students as well as guardians. They asked questions regarding what are they missing out on by not maximizing the talents of both genders as well as if the way a person is raised can affect their gender equality.

The event was considered effective and adequate with an oath to exercise rights, responsibilities and opportunities of girl students.
